

- Can be classified into khadar and Bangar soil.
- Heavy soil also known as Dabar(Daker)
- Thanesar, Fatehabad, Jagadhari region.

3 ARID BROWN SOIL: -(MEDIUM SOIL)

- Rainfall: 50 -75cm, Ph: 7.5-8.5
- Calcareous in nature
- Texture vary from sandy to silty clay

4. SIEROZEM SOIL: (LIGHT AND VERY LIGHT)

- Rainfall: 30-50 cm
- Impacted by salinity and alkanity
- Light soil also known as Rasoli soil.
- Texture Sandy loam to loamy.

5. DESERT SOIL

- Rainfall less than 30 cm
- pH 8.59
- Impacted by wind erosion

No human activity is allowed

☐ PROTECTED FOREST :-74.28%

Restricted entry for few activities like grazing collection of forest product

☐ UNCLASSED FOREST ≥ 9.75 %

No restrictions

- Very dense: 28 kmsq.
- Moderately dense: 450.9 kmsq.
- Open forest: 1123.54 kmsq.
- Largest forest area: Panchkula (390.7km)
- Smallest forest area: Palwal 13.97 km
- Largest area by percentage: Panchkula
- Smallest area by percentage: Fatehabad
