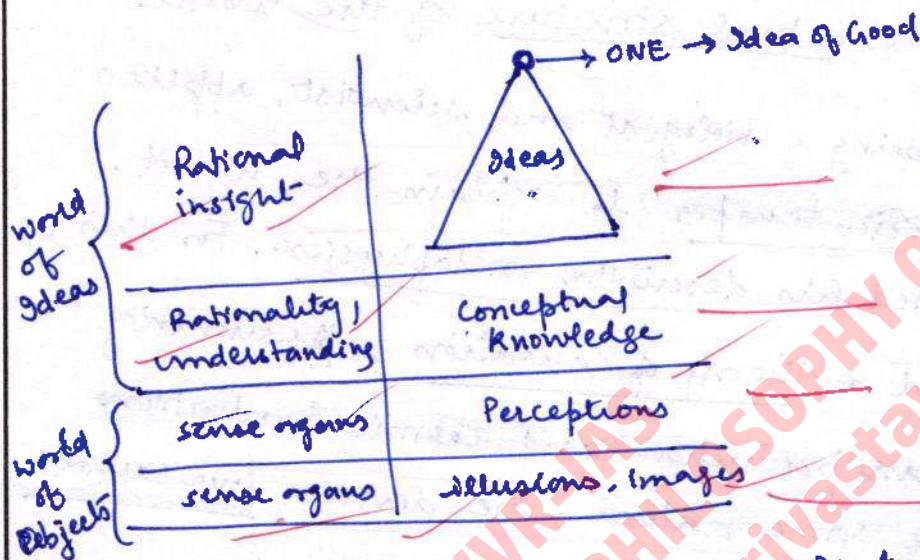

Thus, criticising the Sophists' epistemology, Plato tries to draw a distinction between knowledge and opinion/belief/perception, through his theory of divided lines.



Thus, ~~true knowledge~~ according to Plato,

"knowledge is apprehension of the forms, whereas ~~of the~~ the objects of the world are mere opinions."

Plato also gave his reminiscence theory to explain that knowledge is mere recollection of the acquaintance we had with the forms, when our immaterial soul got embodied in the material body.
