### SALIENT FEATURES OF THE REPRESENTATION OF PEOPLE'S ACT.

# Recognition to political parties:

- 1) EC will review status of political party every 10 year rather than 5
- 2) ensures that the election symbol is not used by any other
- 3) ruling parties do not lose their status due to anti-incumbency
- 4) National party:
  - a) 2% seats or 11 seats in LS from at least 3 different states.
  - b) State party in 4 state
  - c) 6% votes in 4 states + 4 LS seats
- 5) Review of status of national party
  - a) TMC become 7<sup>th</sup> national party (4 states: Aru P, WB, Tripura, Manipur)
  - b) Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) order was amended
- 6) Recent changes:
  - a) performance over two consecutive Lok Sabha or assembly will be considered r/t previous one.
  - b) changes have helped other parties to maintain national party status.
- 7) State party:
  - a) 3% seats in LA.
  - b) 1 LS seat for every 25 seat allotted to that state.
  - c) polled 6% of votes in a State + 1 Lok Sabha or 2 Legislative Assembly seats.
  - d) polled 8% of votes
- 8) Benefits:
  - a) State: allotment of its reserved symbol
  - b) National Party': allotment of its reserved symbol to the candidates set up by it throughout India.
    - i) pan-India symbol helps parties reach out to prospective voters.
    - ii) need only one proposer + two sets of electoral rolls
  - c) broadcast/telecast facilities over Akashvani/Doordarshan.
  - d) Can nominate 40 "Star Campaigners" during General Elections. r/t maximum 20 '
  - e) The travel expenses of star campaigners are not to be accounted

## **ROPA**

# 1) Representation of Peoples Act 1950 (RPA Act 1950) (Qurds)

- a. Qualification of voters.
- b. Preparation of electoral rolls.
- c. **Delimitation** of constituencies.
- d. Allocation of **seats** in the Parliament and state legislatures.

#### 2) RPA Act 1951 provides for(bc-podar)

- a. Actual conduct of elections.
- b. Administrative machinery for conducting elections.
- c. Poll
- d. Election offences.
- e. Election disputes.
- f. **By**-elections.
- g. Registration of political parties

### Election Commission writes to Centre, seeks power to postpone, revoke polls

- 1) Asked center to amend RPa and give power to postpone or countermand polls based on evidence that money power was used to influence voters
- 2) Commission has asked to insert a new clause '58 B' in the ROPA, 1951 to allow adjournment or countermanding of election in the affected polling areas on the grounds of use of money power.
- 3) This will empower Commission to re-schedule the elections in such areas.
- 4) Clause 58 A + proposed 58B -> the expression "countermand the election" would mean ab initio rescinding of the entire electoral process in the constituency
- 5) Clause 58 A empowers the EC to cancel polls only if there is an evidence of booth-capturing or use of muscle power to influence the outcome of elections
- 6) Presently, ECI can take actions under Article 324 of the Constitution.
