63 Correct Answer : B

**Answer Justification :**

The following major decisions were taken at the INC Lahore session, 1929:

- The Round Table Conference was to be boycotted.
  - **Complete independence was declared as the aim of the Congress.**
  - Congress Working Committee was authorised to launch a programme of civil disobedience including non-payment of taxes and all members of legislatures were asked to resign their seats.
  - January 26, 1930 was fixed as the first Independence (*Swarajya*) Day, to be celebrated everywhere.
- Hence, **option (b) is correct answer.**

64 Correct Answer : C

**Answer Justification :**

The '**Pakistan Resolution**' was passed **at the Lahore session of the Muslim League** calling for "grouping of all geographically contiguous Muslim majority areas (mainly north-western and eastern India) into independent states in which the constituent units shall be autonomous and sovereign, and adequate safeguards to Muslims in other areas where they are in a minority". **Hence, statement 1 is correct.**

The Muslim League withdrew its acceptance of the Cabinet mission and gave a call for "direct action" from August 16 to achieve Pakistan. **Hence, statement 2 is correct.**

65 Correct Answer : A

**Answer Justification :**

The Zimmerman Plan is an Indo-German plan which aimed to bring about an all-India insurrection against British government during **the time of World war I. The Jugantar party** raised funds through a series of dacoities which came to be known as **taxicab dacoities and boat dacoities**, so as to work up the Indo-German conspiracy. It was planned that a guerrilla force would be organised to start an uprising in the country, with a seizure of Fort William and a mutiny by armed forces. Unfortunately for the revolutionaries, the plot was leaked out by a traitor.

**Hence, option (a) is correct answer.**

66 Correct Answer : D

**Answer Justification :**

The **Royal Commission on Labour** or the **Whitley Commission on Labour** was set up in 1929 to inquire into the existing conditions of labour in industrial undertakings and plantations in India. **Hence, pair 1 is incorrectly matched.**

**Floud Commission** a **land revenue commission** established by the government of Bengal in 1938. **Hence, pair 2 is incorrectly matched.**

The **Sargent Scheme**, formally known as the **Report of the Sargent Commission on Post-War Education Development in India**, was a 1944 memorandum prepared at the behest of the [British Government of India](#) that outlined the future development of literacy and education in [India](#).

**Hence, pair 3 is incorrectly matched.**

67 Correct Answer : C

**Answer Justification :**

The Lee Commission was set up in 1924 recommended that

- **Direct recruitment to ICS on basis of 50:50 parity between the Europeans and the Indians be reached in 15 years. Hence, statement 1 is correct.**
- **the recruitments for the transferred fields like education and civil medical service be made by provincial governments. Hence, statement 2 is correct.**
- a Public Service Commission be immediately established (as laid down in the Government of India Act, 1919)

68 Correct Answer : C

**Answer Justification :**

The **Saddler commission(1917-18)** was set up to study and report on problems of **Calcutta University** but its recommendations were applicable more or less to other universities also. It reviewed the entire field from school education to university education. **Hence, statement 1 is correct.**

**It recommended that school course should cover 12 years.** Students should enter university after an intermediate stage (rather than matric) for a three-year degree course in university.

**Hence, statement 2 is correct.**
