- Of all the countries in the world, **India faces the highest health burden** of air pollution.
- The average Indian resident is set to lose five years of life expectancy if the WHO guidelines are not followed.
- <u>Delhi</u>, the most polluted megacity in the world stands to <u>lose 10 years of life expectancy</u> if the current air pollution level persists.

17. Glischropus Meghalayanus

Why in News?

Scientists have discovered a new species of bamboo-dwelling bat named Glischropus meghalayanus in Ri Bhoi district of Meghalaya.

About

Bamboo-dwelling bats are a particular kind of bats <u>living in the</u>
internodes of bamboos with specialized morphological characteristics
that help them to adapt to the life inside a bamboo.

Glischropus Meghalayanus

- It is a bamboo-dwelling thick-thumbed bat species <u>found near the</u> <u>forested patch of Nongkhyllem Wildlife Sanctuary</u>.
- The species is <u>small in size</u> and has a <u>dark brown colour</u> with a sulphuryellow belly.



- Significance: This discovery is the first report of a thick-thumbed bat not only from India but also from South Asia.
- Note: Thick-thumbed bats of the genus Glischropus are currently composed of <u>four recognized species from</u> <u>Southeast Asia</u>, two of which were described in recent times.

What were the recent discoveries in Meghalaya?

- In the past few years, <u>three bamboo-dwelling bats</u> have been <u>reported from the area</u> which highlights the ecological significance of the region.
- For instance, from the same forested patches outside **Nongkhyllem Wildlife Sanctuary**, another species of a disk-footed bat **"Eudiscopus denticulus"** was discovered recently.

Nongkhyllem Wildlife Sanctuary

- Situated in the <u>Ri-Bhoi district near Lailad village</u> and spread over an area of 29 sq. kms, Nongkhyllem Wildlife Sanctuary is one of the <u>famous attractions of Meghalaya</u>.
- The Sanctuary falls in the <u>Eastern Himalayan Global biodiversity hotspot</u>.
- The sanctuary supports different species of fauna such as **Royal Bengal Tiger**, **Clouded Leopard**, **Indian Bison**, and **Himalayan Black Bear** etc.
- Among the birds, the rare species which can be spotted here are <u>Manipur Bush Quail</u>, <u>Rufous Necked Hornbill</u> and Brown Hornbill.
- Other Wildlife Sanctuary in Meghalaya:
 - Siju Wildlife Sanctuary
 - Narpuh Wildlife Sanctuary
 - o Baghmara Pitcher Plant Sanctuary
 - Nokrek National Park.
