- Aim →
 - To validate India's capabilities to safeguard the territorial integrity of it's island territories.
 - It also aims to enhance operational synergy and joint warfighting capabilities amongst the three Services.

TROPEX 21

WHY IN NEWS?

 Indian Navy's largest biennial Theatre Level Operational Readiness Exercise (TROPEX 21) is currently underway.

ABOUT

- It is the biennial **Theatre Level Operational Readiness Exercise** (TROPEX).
- It was started as an **annual event from 2005** but from 2015 onwards, it is being **conducted once in two years**.
- Theme → 'Combat Ready, Credible and Cohesive force'.
- Participants → It is Indian Navy's largest war game with participation of all operational units of Indian Navy including ships, submarines, aircraft as well as units of the Indian Army, Indian Air Force and Coast Guard.
- Location → It is being conducted over a vast geographical expanse in the Indian Ocean Region including its adjunct waters.
- Aim → It is aimed at testing combat readiness
 of the Navy in a complex multi-dimensional
 scenario set in the context of the current geo
 strategic environment.
- The Theatre Level exercise also aims to validate
 Navy's offensive-defence capabilities,
 safeguard national interests in the maritime
 domain.
- Overseen By → The conduct of TROPEX is being overseen by Naval Headquarters with participation from all three Commands of the Indian Navy and the Tri-Services Command at Port Blair.
- Phases of TROPEX →

- 'Sea Vigil': In the first phase, the Indian Navy had conducted coastal defence exercise 'Sea Vigil' along the entire coastline and Island territories of India on 12-13 January 2021.
- Exercise Sea Vigil was followed by a largescale Tri-Service joint amphibious exercise AMPHEX-21.

INS VIRAAT

WHY IN NEWS?

 Recently, the Supreme Court has ordered status quo on the dismantling of the Navy's decommissioned aircraft carrier, INS Viraat.

ABOUT

- Originally commissioned by the British Navy as HMS Hermes on November 18, 1959, the aircraft carrier had taken part in the Falkland Islands war in 1982.
- India bought the British carrier in **1986** and rechristened it as INS Viraat.
- It played a major role in Operation Jupiter in 1989 during the Sri Lankan Peacekeeping operation.
- The ship was also deployed during Operation Parakram (2001-02) following the terror attack on the Indian Parliament.
- It has participated in various international joint exercises like Exercise Malabar (USA), Exercise Varuna (French), Naseem-Al-Bahar (Oman Navy).
- It holds the world record as mentioned in the Guinness Book of records for being the longest serving warship of the world.
- The ship's Motto was the Sanskrit phrase 'Jalamev Yashya, Balamev Tasya' which means 'who controls the sea is the powerful'.

ARJUN MAIN BATTLE TANK
