- It can occur due to pressure inside the brain that generates the feeling of a sound being heard. Greater exposure to high-powered microwaves is said not only to interfere with the body's sense of balance but also impact memory and cause permanent brain damage.

- Recently, the <u>World Bank released the biennial</u>
 <u>'Poverty and Shared Prosperity Report 2020'</u>
- Highlights of report -
- Global poverty had declined at the rate of around 1 percentage point per year between 1990 and 2015.
- In two-and-a-half decades (1990-2015), the extreme poverty rate declined by 26 percentage points and it dropped to 10 per cent from nearly 36 per cent.

- But, In 2020, Global extreme poverty is expected to rise for the first time in 20 years because of the disruption caused by COVID-19.
- This will exacerbate the impact of conflict and climate change, which are already slowing down poverty reduction.
- The pandemic may push another 88 million to 115 million into extreme poverty or having to live on less than \$1.50 per day, resulting in a total of 150 million such individuals.

Poverty and Shared Prosperity Report and India

- India, along with Nigeria, is considered to have the largest number of the poor in the world.
- India tops the global list in terms of absolute number of poor, according to the last national survey of 2012-13.
- The country accounted for 139 million of the total 689 million people living in poverty in 2017.
- India joins the ranks of countries termed as 'conflict-affected' and 'fragile' in World Bank terminologies.

Exp:

National Digital Health Mission

- The National Digital Health Mission had been announced by PM Modi on August 15, 2020.
- The mission aims to create an integrated healthcare system linking practitioners with the patients digitally by giving them access to realtime health records.
- Currently, the Pradhan Mantri Digital Health Mission (PM-DHM) is being implemented in a pilot phase in 6 UTs.
- Through this mission, a unique digital health ID will be provided to the people, which will contain all the health records of the person.
- The nationwide rollout of PM-DHM coincides with National Health Authority (NHA) celebrating the third anniversary of Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY).
- The key components of PM-DHM include a health ID for every citizen that will also work as their health account, to which personal health records can be linked and viewed with the help of a mobile application.
