OnlyIAS PRAHAAR : ENVIRONMENT

- **Illegal killing:** Hunting along migration routes threatens migratory bird species.
- **Stopover habitat loss**: Migratory birds use stopover sites to feed, rest and reenergize during their migration period. But many stopover sites are threatened due to increased urbanization and overexploitation.
- **Increasing Light pollution**: The artificial light at night adversely affects migration by confusing the birds.
- Loss of biodiversity: Due to the overexploitation, unsustainable use of natural resources, population explosion along with increased weather variabilities, and climate change has resulted in the loss of biodiversity.
- **Declining water sources**: Majority of peninsular lakes in India are shrinking in their size, due to heavy use by the industry and farmers.

IMPORTANCE OF MIGRATORY BIRDS:

- **Maintaining biodiversity:** Saving migratory birds saves the ecosystem in their permanent habitat and maintains the biodiversity in the temporary stopover area.
- **Locust attack**: Prevalent absence of these birds from an ecosystem can lead to disasters like a Locust attack.
- **Balancing ecosystem**: Migratory birds play a critical role in the ecosystem balance, helpful in pollinating plants, dispersing seeds, and acting as pest control agents.

WAY FORWARD:

- **Bird-friendly landscape**: There is an urgent need to create Bird-friendly landscaping and maintain natural habitat to help birds roost and build their nests.
- **Minimizing the plastic pollution**: Banning single-use plastics and avoiding dumping of single-use plastics in water bodies.
- **Monitoring programme**: Long-term monitoring programs to assess the migration trends in birds, diseases monitoring and enumeration
- **Educating people**: About bird migrations and their impacts. Seeking local support for nesting and conservation of migratory birds
- **Minimizing the harvest**: Harvesting operations such as fishing activities need to be minimized/abandoned/banned during the migration season.
- **Strict law enforcement:** It is required to support the conservation of migratory birds.
- **Modern technologies**: Like drones can be used to track poachers in areas where birds converge to save the migratory bird from the illegal hunting.
