- Nodal Department → <u>Department of Science and Technology</u>.
- Funding → It <u>supports aspiring or budding entrepreneurs of considerable potential</u> for pursuing a promising technology business idea over a period up to 18 months with a subsistence grant up to **Rs 30,000 per** month with a maximum cap for total support of **Rs 3.6 lakh**.
